### ABSTRACT

Disaster Management – Drought 2013 – Declaration of 119 Mandals as Drought Affected in the State during South West Monsoon 2013 – Orders – Issued.

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### **ORDER**

During South West Monsoon-2013 (1-6-2013 to 30-09-2013), the State received a rainfall of 634.1 mm as against the normal rainfall of 624.1 mm with a deficit of (+) 2%.

2. As per the Andhra Pradesh Handbook for Management of Drought, 1995 and Manual for Drought Management published by Ministry of Agriculture, Govt. of India, 2009, the proposals for declaration of drought should be examined with reference to the following norms and the Collectors should send specific report to the Government taking mandals as a unit:

- a) Deficiency in rainfall of (-) 25% and above in Mandals where the annual normal rainfall is more than 1000 mm., followed by (-) 20% and above in Mandals where the annual normal rainfall is 750 mm to 999.9 mm and (-)15% and above in mandals where the annual normal rainfall is less than 750 mm i.e 749.9 mm.
- b) Compression/reduction in the cropped areas of 50% and above under all principal crops.
- c) Normal reduction in crop yields of 50% and above, comparative with average yields. However, in the case of high input oriented (seed rate heavy and cost also prohibitive) crops like groundnut, Bengal gram, hybrid sunflower etc. reduction in yield of 40% and above also should be reckoned as affected by drought, yield compared with previous 5 years.
- d) Dry spells and its impact on crop damages.
- e) Normalized Vegetative Differential Index (NDVI)
- f) Moisture Adequacy Index (MAI)

For considering declaration of drought out of the (4) norms suggested, the first norm of rainfall deficiency is compulsory and out of the remaining (3) norms, any two norms must be fulfilled, apart from norms (e)and(f) that would be prepared by NRSC and ANGRAU respectively.

The above Committee was constituted to scrutinize the proposals submitted by the District Collectors for Kharif, 2013, National Crop Forecasting Center, Pune/NRSC GoI, (NDVI)/ ANGRAU (MAI) (Agro-Climate Research Centre), Director, Economics & Statistics (rainfall data, yield data based on crop cutting experiment) as per the guidelines in the Andhra Pradesh Handbook for Management of Drought, 1995 and Manual for Drought Management published by Ministry of Agriculture, Govt. of India, 2009, and recommend names of only those mandals that fulfill the criteria recommended for declaring mandals as Drought affected. After detailed examination of the proposals received from the District Collectors of Anantapur, Chittoor, YSR Kadapa, Vizianagaram, Mahabubnagar, Medak & Nalgonda for declaration of mandals as drought affected on basis of dry spells, reduction in yield, area, apart from rainfall deficiency, MAI, NDVI and general situation in the mandals, 119 mandals were finalized as eligible for declaration as Drought affected mandals during Kharif, 2013. 5. Government after careful examination and keeping in view of the reports furnished in the reference 1<sup>st</sup> read above, have decided to declare the 119 mandals [as in Annexure-II] in 7 districts of Anantapuram (59), Chittoor (33), YSR Kadapa (16), Vizianagaram (5), Mahabubnagar (3), Medak (2) & Nalgonda (1), as drought affected mandals.

6. The District Collectors concerned shall ensure deletion of the notified municipal/urban areas and areas falling under permanent assured irrigation sources .Urban mandals which are not declared as drought affected, shall be treated on par with drought affected mandals for the purpose of drinking water. The District Collectors concerned shall issue the notification in the District Gazette as mentioned in Annexure-I in the Telugu language, which is the official language of the State, as per the Andhra Pradesh Official Languages Act, 1995.

7. The District Collectors concerned are requested to take immediate further necessary action.

8. The Commissioner and Director of Printing, Stationery and Stores Purchase (Printing Wing), A.P., Hyderabad is requested to publish the notification in the extra-ordinary issue of Andhra Pradesh Gazette.

In the circumstances reported by the respective District Collectors, the Government declare that drought exists during the South West Monsoon during the current year 2013 in the 119 mandals annexed to this order. The concerned District Collectors are requested to take necessary further action and notify the specific mandals/specific areas in the mandal in the District Gazette to enable farmers to avail credit facilities and to take up relief operations. The concerned District Collector shall ensure deletion of the notified Municipal/Urban areas and areas falling under permanent assured irrigation sources where water is being supplied for crops from drought affected mandals though for purpose of drinking water only they shall be treated on par with drought affected mandals.

The concerned District Collectors are requested to furnish (10) copies of the District Gazette Notification to the Government.
